

Maboart has been represented in numerous exhibitions both nationally and internationally for many years and can look back on an extensive oeuvre. Despite this impressive artistic consistency, they have not had a major exhibition in the region for quite some time, even though they are based here. We aim to fill this gap and will present a solo exhibition with the artists this fall, from September 7 to October 27, 2024, at the Kunsthalle Palazzo.

As in their previous work, maboart has once again created site-specific and installationbased pieces for this exhibition. The show does not have a retrospective character but consists almost exclusively of new works that were specifically conceived and produced for the venue.

The exhibition revolves around questions of transience and vulnerability, addressing the fragility of states of being and materials, and contrasts this with the desire for preservation and the pursuit of halting decay processes. In doing so, the exhibition reflects on current global political and ecological issues, attempting to find a balance between technological progress and the preservation of ecological equilibrium. The current exhibition by maboart | bohren & magoni takes visitors on a fascinating journey through six thematically designed rooms, raising profound questions about nature, transience, and the fragility of existence.

ROOM 1

Room 1 welcomes visitors with an installation of delicate fig leaves, dipped in black ink and suspended from threads. When a breeze blows through, the leaves begin to dance, seemingly coming to life. This installation combines symbolic elements from art history, referencing shame, fertility, as well as censorship and the restriction of free speech. In parallel, two screens display footage of algae moving underwater, symbolizing the fragility and mortality of life.

ROOM 2

Room 2 resembles a sterile, medical environment, where a latex skin, bearing the texture of birch bark, is placed under constant surveillance. This installation plays with the fragility of protection and monitoring. On monitors, the surveillance image is multiplied and distorted, raising questions about observation and control.

ROOM 3

In Room 3, three projectors create a rhythmic and meditative atmosphere by casting intertwined images of blue algae swaying in water onto the walls. The projections evoke the origins of life, linking the past with a possible future where algae could play a versatile role.

ROOM 4

Room 4 is bathed in intense red light that dominates the atmosphere. Under this light, moon violets arranged on brass rods resemble a sprawling field. These plants, once used as protective amulets, cast fascinating shadows on the walls, immediately drawing visitors into the installation. At the back of the room, lead containers filled with water, black ink, and linseed oil, as well as bandages soaked in beeswax and a cloth drenched in disinfectant, invite a deeper reflection on themes of protection, vulnerability, and hope.

ROOM 5

Room 5 offers visitors a place to rest on two thronelike golden chairs. In this room, bathed in blue light, a serene and contemplative atmosphere is created, inviting reflection and conversation.

The exhibition concludes in Room 6, a gold-lit room with a red carpet, symbolizing eternity and new beginnings.
