# Acts of Friendship

An exhibition conceived collaboratively by the museum team with works from the collection of the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst

Act 3 - June 10 to September 17 2023

These days, we often associate friendship with the notion of a bond based on mutual trust that supports us, not least in times of crisis. Yet friendships are also complex, contradictory structures that cannot be framed within normative categories and that may indeed be subversive in character. Thus, friendships are not only able to support us as individuals in how we behave towards the world around us; they can also be a pathway towards making ourselves heard as a group and thereby rebelling against social (power) structures. In *Acts of Friendship* the concern is not primarily with caring friendships linked to our inner circle, rather with alliances and the value systems that go along with that, reaching far into the sphere of the social and the political—it's about complicity, alliances and solidarity.

The team at the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst have selected for the *Acts of Friendship* exhibition works from the collection that in their view represent a particular aspect of friendship. The works, around 30 in all, are shown over a period of eight months and are divided into three theme-based groups of works – three acts. In the third and final act, works are presented that chafe at the concept of friendship: while certain works create new connections or question existing ones, in the case of others it's about the absence of friendship, about loneliness and ruptures. Moreover, in several works, questions are raised about the importance and harnessing of friendly relations on a personal, social and inter-state level.

In addition, as part of *Acts of Friendship* – Act 3, a new work was created that represents a snapshot of the museum and its team. The video titled *Staff at Migros Museum* by Annika Eriksson belongs to a series of filmic portraits of various art institutions, which the artist had begun in 2000. The work is presented here for the first time and will be added to the collection afterwards. The team, which is already visible in *Acts of Friendship* in the selection of works, itself appears before the camera in Eriksson's work and is thus present in the exhibition room, too.

Although the works selected for the exhibition represent the personal ideas, views and approaches to friendship of the individual team members, they also serve as a starting point for questions related to this theme, which is as complex as the approaches themselves. It is no coincidence that some of the works shown come from a time in which art, daily life and social practice flowed one into the other; examples of this in Act 3 are the works by Rirkrit Tiravanija and Alicia Framis. This art movement from the 1990s, known as *Relational Aesthetics*, is based on relations and actions between people. It not only shaped the beginnings of our museum, leaving traces behind in the collection, it also gives us the opportunity today to link up with old and new friendship networks and involve local communities. As an act of friendship towards our visitors, entrance is free to all our visitors for the duration of this exhibition.
